President's Message

Branch 242 is affiliated with <u>Early Day Gas Engine and Tractor Association</u>, <u>Inc.</u> (EDGETA) which is spoken as edge, like the *edge* of a razor blade.

EDGETA is a national organization comprised of branches, or clubs, with members interested in tractors and engines. Membership in EDGETA is gained only through the branches, and is contingent upon a branch having a minimum of 20 members with dues paid, their names appearing on the roster submitted by the branch to EDGETA, and the adherence to the rules set forth by EDGETA.

A benefit of membership in a branch, and therefore, membership in EDGETA, is liability coverage for every member. This liability insurance coverage is provided by EDGETA as a benefit of membership, though a contract with an insurance company.

Specifically, the liability insurance coverage requires compliance with the EDGETA Safety Rules, and members or branches that do not follow the rules, and are involved in a claim, may be denied the liability insurance coverage. This liability insurance coverage is to protect the other person, not the member.

Upon joining a branch, the new member receives a Yellow plastic card/badge and a white sticker, with a year on it, that must be applied to the Yellow card. The purpose of the Yellow badge with year date sticker is to indicate current membership in EDGETA. Each member is issued only one card and replacements for loss or damage must be made through the branch. Year stickers are issued annually when membership dues are paid.

Branches have access to additional insurance products that are sometimes needed for shows, displays, etc., and all elected Directors and Officers of each branch have <u>Directors and Officers</u> (D&O) coverage.

So here are what you, a member of Branch 242 must do:

- Have your Yellow card, and year sticker, with you at all Branch 242 events.
- Familiarize yourself with the rules described by EDGETA on their web site at: www.edgeta.com
- Be diligent in following the EDGETA rules.
- If you should be involved in an incident that is EDGETA related, inform the Safety Officer, or another Branch 242 Officer.

Did You Know?

- Did you know that diesel engines and Budweiser were funded by the same person? The famous German immigrant brought with him his brewery experience and opened a brewer's supply store. After that he bought the American rights to Rudolf Diesel's inventions and established the Diesel Engine Company.
- The word tractor comes from the Latin word "trahere" which means to pull. At first the meaning of this word was "an engine meant for wagons or other implements." In 1859, it got new meaning – traction engine.
- Cyrus McCormick is considered the "Father of Modern Agriculture." He invented the world's first mechanical reaper in 1831, which helped replace manpower for machine power to harvest crops. His invention is often cited as key in the westward expansion of the United States.
- In the late 1800s, the first steam-engine tractors were invented. Many believed this to be a crazy idea.
- There are over 16 million tractors around the world which means that one third of the total energy used in agricultural production is used by tractors.
- In 1890's, the first petrol-powered tractors were introduced but were not powerful enough to complete most of the farming tasks. However, later in the 1920's, the first all-purpose tractor appeared on the market and replaced horses.
- At age 33, John Deere worked as a blacksmith and designed his first plow for Midwestern farmers. The polished-steel plow became popular due to its ability to cut through sticky prairie soil and resulted in demand for Deere to build more over the next five years.
- Approximately 60% of the farmers in the United States are 55 years old or older. Aging farmers have led to concern about the long-term health of family farms.
