Minutes – January 3, 2018

Meeting called to order at 7:03 P.M.

Flag Salute led by Grant Gemel.

Board members in attendance: Grant Gemel, V.P, Barbara Gemel, Secretary, Etta Dunn, Treasurer, Roger Kindel, Safety.

Minutes from November were approved. 1st motioned by Nikki Kindel, 2nd by Etta Dunn.

Grant announced that Gary was unable to attend due to his Mothers illness.

Treasurer's report: Currently \$2,849.17 plus \$20.00 cash on hand. We had one new member from the Flabob event, Jeff Corona. We currently have 33 members.

Dues Announcement: Members have until the March meeting to pay 2018 dues. Currently dues are \$30.00 per person or \$ 50.00 per couple. \$ 12.00 goes to EDGETA insurance. It was announced the board is discussing the possibly of raising dues to supplement our treasury to facilitate additional events.

Events: Grant went over the events which are usually held for 2018. Including Tractor Supply, Helendale, Cal Poly, San Bernardino Co. Fair, Lucerne Valley 4th of July Parade, and so on. Grant suggested that we use the time off the next couple of months to repair tractors, trailers, etc.

A discussion was led by Grant regarding supplemental insurance for our tractors, especially during transport and such. Initial contacts by Paul and Grant through an insurance broker and discussions with Hagerty insurance, revealed that we could purchase supplemental insurance for about \$65.00 per year per tractor. Their only stipulation is that the tractor be stored in a lockable garage. Some of us do not have the facilities to do so. We are continuing to search other insurance companies. Lance said that he has insurance through American Collector's Insurance Co.

Grant encouraged members to review their insurance policies to determine their coverage. Some members appeared to be confused thinking that they were covered from the time they leave their homes. This is NOT the case. EDGETA only insures tractors after they are on the ground at events.

Paul Dunn added that when you check with your insurance carrier as to how far from your home your insurance is in effect, you can apply for a rider if traveling more than the covered distance. Golf carts are not covered by EDGETA insurance. A separate policy must be purchased.

Safety Roger Kindel: Roger spoke about while we have some "down time" to check our trailers bearings, tires, fuel filters, tire pressure etc. Most trailer tires require 50- 110 pounds of pressure

depending on load. Make sure you know your limits. Use the time to repair your tractors as well.

Round Table: Lance and Roger Meeker brought up AAA coverage for handling trailer flat tires. It was determined that if you have the proper coverage through AAA you are covered. Etta Dunn commented on how much she enjoyed the Christmas pot luck.

An opportunity drawing was held for a belt joining/ crimping device along with the staples, which was generously donated by Lance Wilson. \$45.00 was raised? L.T. Burks won the drawing. Lance shared a glass tractor which was sold by Avon products containing perfume. Lance also shared a Shayler tube patch kit for motorists from possibly the forty's era. An additional item was passed around brought by Lance for the club to guess what it was. L.T. Burks was able to identify it. It was a 1913 era rubber patch vulcanizer. A special thanks to Lance for bringing these great historical items to our meetings.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:50 P.M.
